



Grammar: Word order with adverbs of place and time

Ortsangaben (*adverbs of place*) beantworten die Frage „Wo?“. Sie stehen normalerweise am Ende eines Satzes:

Let's go **to London**. Please meet me **in the town centre**. Is that Tom **over there**?
We waited **outside the bank**. Dad is working **in the garden**. Please come **here**.

Zeitangaben (*adverbs of time*) beantworten die Frage „Wann?“. Sie stehen auch am Ende eines Satzes:

I get up **at 7 o'clock**. We get up **at 7.30 every morning**. I think you should go **now!**
He was born **in 1950**. She arrived **early**. They were very **late**.

Genauere Zeitangaben stehen meistens vor ungenaueren.

Falls Orts- und Zeitangaben zusammen in einem Satz vorkommen, dann steht **Ort vor Zeit**:

I stayed **at home yesterday**. Were they **here this morning**? He lived **in France for ten years**.
He'll be **here soon**. She was **in the garden yesterday**. I was **in Berlin last Thursday**.

Genauere Ortsangaben stehen auch meistens vor ungenaueren.
