

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#### **PREFACE**

This study is a revised and shortened version of a thesis accepted by the University of Oxford in 1982 for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy. George Caird acted as supervisor. Over several years he patiently read at least three drafts of each chapter, always producing many pages of handwritten criticism. My debt to him is recorded elsewhere, most obviously in the volume of memorial essays entitled *The Glory of Christ in the New Testament* (Oxford, Clarendon Press, 1987). But to this he would like me to add that our original interest in this investigation was as a kind of *Grundausbildung* for his forthcoming New International Critical Commentary on Hebrews. I still treasure a letter he wrote me in 1982 in which he stated his intention to build much of his commentary on the following work. His unheralded death in 1984 can only mean the loss of what would have been a memorable exercise in New Testament exegesis.

I would also like to thank those of my colleagues, at Davis and elsewhere, who read the thesis in whole or in part and made suggestions. To my former pupils Bill Kynes and Mike Tristram I owe a special debt of gratitude, for they helped to stimulate and refine questions which in 1978 were just beginning to be asked. The Senior New Testament Seminar at Oxford listened patiently to papers on the christology and eschatology of Hebrews and made probing criticisms.

It is perhaps especially fitting that this work should have taken its final shape while I was serving as New Testament lecturer at Mansfield College, Oxford. James Moffatt, who produced the first International Critical Commentary on Hebrews, and Caird, who was to do the second, were both at Mansfield. And anyone who wears a Mansfield tie bears constant testimony to Hebrews 1:2 – Deus Locutus est Nobis in Filio, as the Latinized college motto has it. I should like to express my thanks to the Senior Common Room there, particularly the Rev. Charles Brock and Dr. and Mrs. M.P. Mahony, for their friendship and support in what were sometimes difficult circumstances.

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Special gratitude is also due to Prof. R. McL. Wilson, who first showed interest in this work as a monograph. His newly published, outstanding exposition of Hebrews reached me barely in time to take account of it here, however minimally. Professor Graham Stanton, the editor of this series, provided a series of careful suggestions which were matched only by his great patience in awaiting the outcome.

I should also like to thank the staff of Cambridge University Press, and in particular Mr. Alex Wright, for their patience and skill in guiding the book to a successful conclusion.

For many years my friends Harp and Barbara Junta supported me both personally and financially; without their faithful help I could not have completed this work. They are too unselfish to expect my gratitude, but I should like publicly to record it.

Finally, to my parents I owe all. Apart from life and a loving home, they gave me their encouragement and help from beginning to end. My father wished very much to see this work in print, but his long and ultimately unsuccessful battle with leukemia thwarted his intent. Making his triumphal entry on the morning of Palm Sunday, 1986, he joined the innumerable ranks of those who, following the lead of their great forerunner, have gone through the veil and penetrated the greatest mystery of all.
