

## Rules for 2–4 students

For 2–4 students learning infinitive and simple past forms:

Place the cards with the verb forms down on the table. Shuffle them around. They shouldn't overlap. Find verb-pairs in the infinitive and simple past. When you found a pair, you can play again. If you don't find a pair, it's the next student's turn. The student who finds the most pairs wins.

For 2–4 students learning infinitive, simple past and past participle forms:

Place the cards with the verb forms down on the table. Shuffle them around. They shouldn't overlap. Now you need to find all three verb forms (triplet) that belong to one verb. When you found a triplet, you can play again. If you don't find a triplet, it's the next student's turn. The student who finds the most triplets wins.

## Rules for 1 student

For 1 student learning infinitive and simple past forms:

Place the cards with the verb forms down on the table. Shuffle them around. They shouldn't overlap. Now you need to find all verb-pairs in the infinitive and simple past.

For 1 student learning infinitive, simple past and past participle forms:

Place the cards with the verb forms down on the table. Shuffle them around. They shouldn't overlap. Now you need to find all three verb forms (triplet) that belong to one verb.
